Compass points- used to show direction- you need to know the 8 point compass- North, North East, East, South East, South, South West, West, North West. Remember 'Never Eat Shredded Wheat'.

Scale- The link between the distance on a map and its real distance on the ground.

Symbols- A simple drawing or sign used to give information and save space on a map.

Relief- the shape of the land.

Contours- a line drawn on a map to join places at the same above sea level.

Climate- the average weather recorded on average over many years.

LIC (Low Income Country)- a country with a GNI per person less than US \$1045.

HIC (High Income Country)- a country with a GNI per person over US\$ 12746

GNI (Gross National Income)- the level of income in a country- this is the most common measure of wealth and development.

Population- the number of people in a place or country.

Life expectancy- the average number of years a person is expected to live.
