Dear Parents & Carers

Late on Monday morning this week, we heard that we were going to have a 'Section 8 ungraded inspection' from Ofsted. We all took a deep breath, cleared diaries, and summoned up the necessary energy. The inspectors were very fair, and whilst we are content with the result, we were disappointed that the decision was made to give the College a second ungraded inspection in a row. Essentially,

these inspections are designed to test whether the school remains good or whether it is inadequate. The result will be published within 30 days. I am not allowed to give you the result, but can tell you that the inspection is not designed to reveal whether a school is outstanding or not, and even if it is, no improved grade will be given. For several years our results have been amongst the best in the south west and this year was no exception. We think it's extremely important that pupils achieve great exam results because that opens doors for them.

The results we achieve were hardly mentioned in the inspection we had. The day after the inspectors left, this year's validated results and comparison tables were released, and

they are exceptional yet again. What is even more impressive, is the context that our pupils have worked in and still achieved these results. Our



focus is on the school.

The indications we see about next year's results, and the recruitment of pupils into Year 7 in 2024 are very strong indeed.

We are not perfect, certainly. We are not complacent. We will persist with our intention to give your child the style of education that we would want for our own children, to give them the very best education for their future lives.

Congratulations again to Year 11 of 2023. Your results are extraordinary.

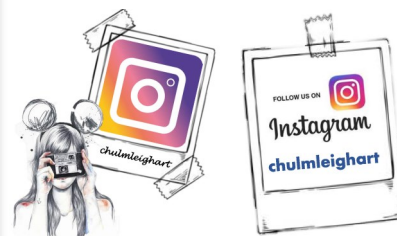

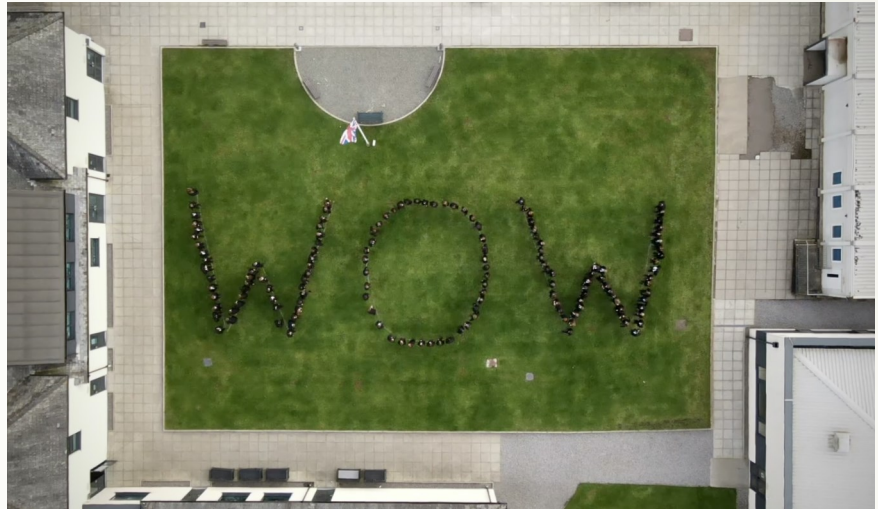


Chulmleigh College Achieves the Gold Standard Once Again!

The DfE has just released this year's school comparison table and we know our pupils will be overjoyed that we are first in the county for the GCSE EBacc score (non-selective state schools).

84% of pupils were entered for the gold standard Ebacc, and achieved an average point score of 5.24. These subjects are considered essential to many degrees and open up lots of doors.

Executive Headteacher Mr Michael Johnson said, "Ex-pupil Christian Rushbrooke, who is now a film maker, kindly offered his time to take the photos to celebrate our pupils' amazing achievements. He came up with the idea to combine a celebration of our GCSE results by showing the enthusiasm of the pupils who have just joined us. Year 7's photo message to the Year 11 class of 2023 is a joy to watch and we all salute the pupils who achieved this. This was all the more remarkable because they did not allow pandemic disruption to get in



their way. Some of the results achieved are not only the best in the county, but the best in the region too.

We are also delighted and impressed with the start Year 7 have made at the College, and they deserve so much credit for their positive can-do approach. It's great to see them celebrate like this. It is amazing to see such resilience in a group of 153 11-year-olds from 27 primaries. They really are determined to give their best."

The India Cup

As part of our transition experience for Year 6 pupils moving into Year 7 at Chulmleigh College, we have a competition in the humanities faculty called the India Cup Project. Pupils are invited to produce an A3 poster over the summer holidays that they have researched and produced independently. The content needs to be on the theme of either Geography, History or Religion, Philosophy and Ethics. Pupils brought in a wide array of informative and beautifully presented posters at the start of the term. A judging team consisting of different subject specialists, including Mr Johnson and Miss Hockin as historians, Mr Payne and Miss Woods as RPE specialists and Mr Stevens and Mrs Payne as geographers, met to discuss the pupils' work and decide the winners for each subject in three categories. Every year, pupils sometimes have their own interpretation of the task that does not fit into the categories. 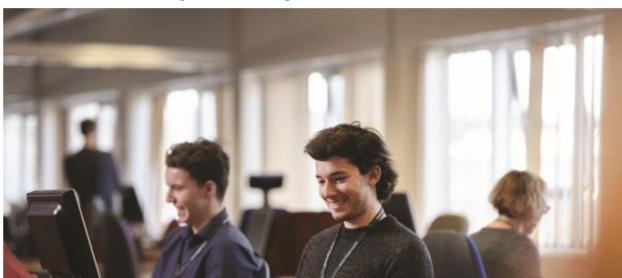

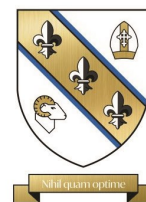

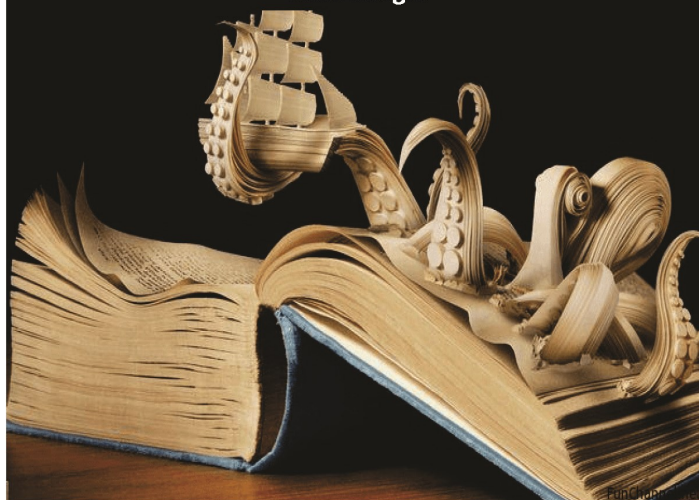
