What should I already know?

- To talk about e-safety rules and strategies that help you stay safe
- To talk about inappropriate or upsetting content and how to report it
- To be able to understand why some information should be kept private and keep passwords safe
- To be able to explain what an avatar is and why you might use one

Key learning

- To explore key concepts to online safety
- To know more than 1 way of reporting inappropriate content and contact
- To be able to explain what a digital footprint is and why it is important
- To be able to talk about how to distinguish between fact, fiction and opinion on the internet

Key vocabulary

Content – Things you see online. It can be writing, pictures or videos.

Personal information – Information like your full name, address, age, login details or email address that should be kept personal to you and not given to people you don't know.

Internet – A computer network providing a variety of information and communication facilities.

Website – A set of related web pages/information located in one place

Spoof website – A website that tricks users into thinking that it represents the truth, sometimes pretending to be another website.

Webpage – A page online that is part of a website

E-Safety – Staying safe online, following the SMART-E school rules

Digital footprint – Information about a person that exists on the internet and shows your online activity

Fact – Something that is true and there is proof eg. The sun is a star

Fiction – Something invented or untrue. Usually made up for a reason.

Opinion – What someone thinks eg. Cats are the best animal, not necessarily based on facts

Key questions

- Why do I need to keep my personal information safe?
- What information do I need to keep safe?
- What are the school e-safety rules?
- How can I keep myself safe online?
- What do I do if I see something upsetting online?
- How can I report upsetting or inappropriate content? Is there more than 1 way?
- What is a digital footprint and why is it important?
- Is everything I read on the internet true? How can I tell?



The CLICK CEOP button can be found on most webpages, and is a quick way of reporting a webpage that has inappropriate content on.

If you see anything inappropriate or upsetting online, the first thing to do is to tell an adult (either a teacher if you are at school, or an adult at home).

You won't get into trouble, we just need to know where/how the content appeared so that we can report it.
