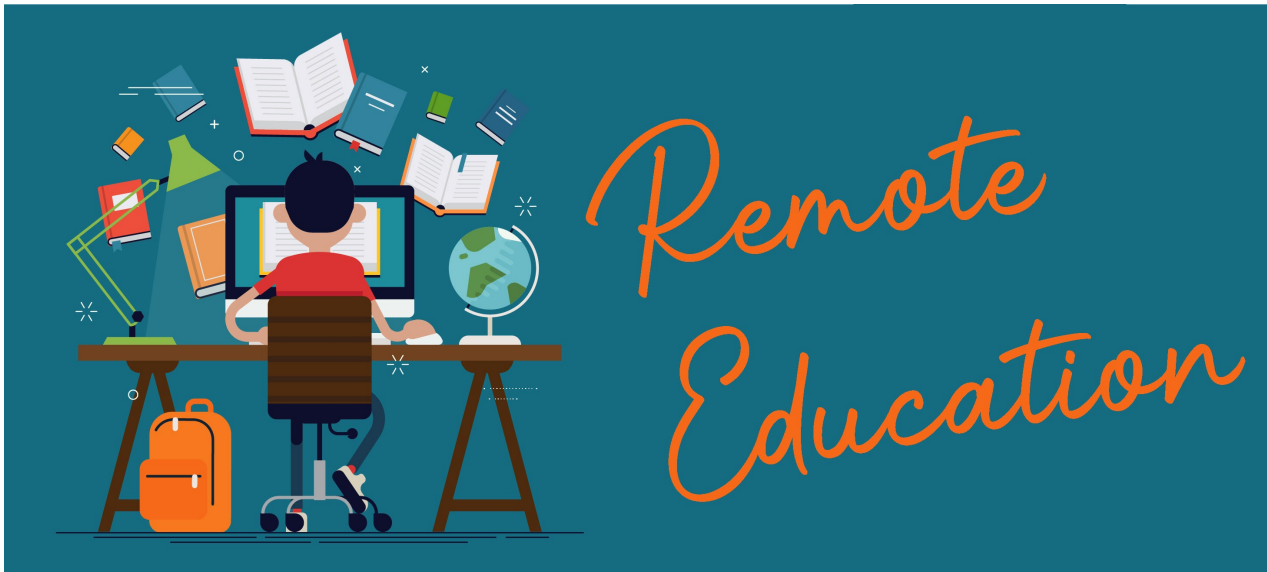

# Quick Guide for Remote Education & Live Lessons



## Live Online Lesson Guidance for Pupils, Parents & Carers

- ◇ Online sessions should be accessed in a quiet area where pupils can concentrate.
- ◇ Other family members should be made aware that a live lesson is taking place in this space.
- ◇ All pupils' cameras are disabled. Teachers will use their own discretion regarding the use of their camera. All pupils will be able to hear their teacher.
- ◇ Pupils will be muted when they join a lesson, they will be unmuted by the teacher when appropriate.
- ◇ The live lessons should not be recorded by any pupil, parent or carer.
- ◇ No information from the lesson will be shared outside of the school environment.
- ◇ Do not share any data, such as names or other information, that may be heard or seen as part of the lesson.
- ◇ Normal classroom standards of behaviour are expected. Inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated and will be addressed. If a pupil behaves inappropriately they will be removed from the lesson. This will then be addressed.

Online lessons and live lessons are to enhance the learning and curriculum for our pupils and are not a forum for parents to feedback, or to use as an opportunity for parent-teacher discussions.
