
- Lapford is a village in Devon, which is in England.

- The UK is officially known as the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland
- The UK includes the island of Great Britain,
 Northern Ireland and many smaller islands
- Great Britain is an island—it is surrounded by seas:

Irish Sea, North Sea, English Channel

- The Republic of Ireland is not a country of the United Kingdom
- Each of the countries in the United Kingdom has a capital city, flag and a national flower.


