# Drama

## Year 7 Drama

Year 7s have been working on the epic poem Beowulf in Drama and pupils have designed Dragon puppets in the style of Warhorse or Lion King puppets. There were some clever and creative designs and here are two of them. Well done Jess and Yeva.

Sara Feasey, Head of Expressive Arts

1) Wings  
The wings are made from silk stretched over a wire frame. The wing is connected to the body by stitching. This enables it to move up and down using the handle.

2) handle  
The handles are made of wood, that is sanded so smooth for the hand. Used to control the puppet.

3) face  
made with silk painted, that is stretched over a wire frame.

4) teeth  
made polystyrene teeth. mouth permanently open.

5) eyes  
made of pingpong balls with a hole so LED lights can be seen (in red).

6) Horns  
Made of polystyrene covered with a fine grade of silk as below.

7) Red trim  
made of metallic red fabric.

8) body  
made of a wire frame wrapped in silk painted and then covered with individual transparent scales.

9) tail  
As above but with gradually smaller scales.

10) stomach  
a non-scaled silver streak running from neck to tail.

Colours used in the product

The body silk is thicker than the wings so to allow for the wings to be more lighter and easier to move all the silk covering I did with silk.

which will be inside the dragon, it is needed to hold its shape.

Frame:  
Needed to hold the base of the dragon. Which will be attached to the belt around the body.

Made of:  
There will be soft plasticine around the metal frame to give it a smooth shape. The wings can be made of metal wire. And to finish this off there will be colored fabric (like silk or nylon) and feathers for splendor and glossiness.

Due to the use of lightweight materials, the costume is easy to wear.

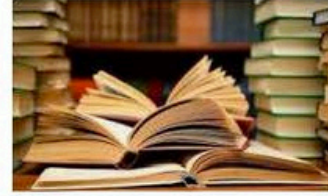

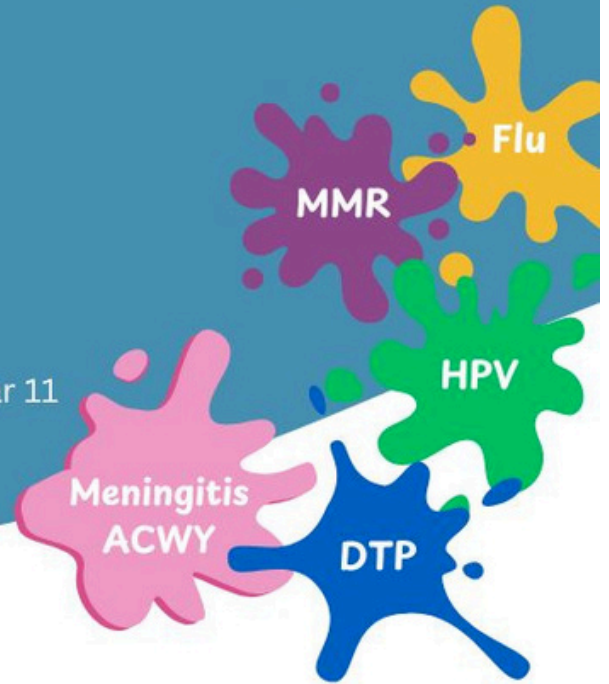

## Book of the Week:

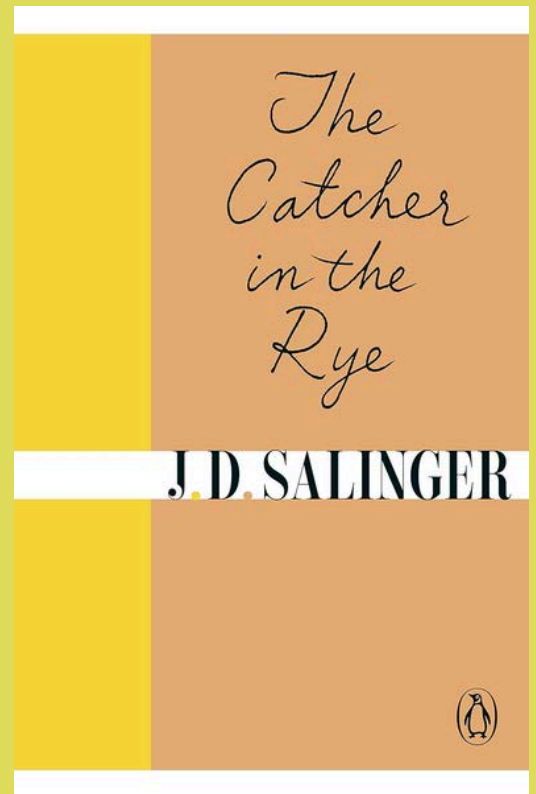
### Catcher in the Rye by J D Salinger

Witty, wise and bittersweet, The Catcher in the Rye is the ultimate American coming-of-age novel - a timeless classic.

It's Christmas and Holden Caulfield has just been expelled from yet another school. Fleeing the crooks at Pencey Prep, he pinballs around New York City seeking solace in fleeting encounters - shooting the bull with strangers in dive hotels, wandering alone round Central Park, getting beaten up by pimps and cut down by erstwhile girlfriends.

The city is beautiful and terrible, in all its neon loneliness and seedy glamour, its mingled sense of possibility and emptiness. Holden passes through it like a ghost, thinking always of his kid sister Phoebe, the only person who really understands him, and his determination to escape the phonies and find a life of true meaning.

The Catcher in the Rye is an all-time classic coming-of-age story: an elegy to teenage alienation, capturing the deeply human need for connection and the bewildering sense of loss as we leave childhood behind.
