Congratulations to our Ten Tors Teams!

Dear Parents and Carers

The Ten Tors challenge is always an inspiring event, but this year, our pupils took it to a new level. As acting Head of Year 8 last year, I got out onto the moor a few times to behold our volunteers work wonders honing our pupils into hardened and experienced moor walkers.

For the first time ever, we had three 35 mile teams, all made up of Year 9s. This was not just unusual, but unique - no other organisation had so many pupils, so young, complete the 35 mile challenge. And they did it in style: all three teams crossed the finish line as full teams of six (not a single team member came even close to dropping out), and every pupil was smiling as they crossed the line, which is not as common.

Credit for this incredible feat goes to the children themselves. Our Ten Tors team members took part in our 25 mile Ten Tors challenge last year, while they were in Year 8, meaning that they have been working together for almost two years, and it showed. This is an event pivoting on teamwork and each of our teams worked as a single unit, and success was never in doubt.

What makes this even more impressive is that our Ten Tors teams included a full cross-section of our school population. We are strong believers in comprehensive education and our pupils represented the profile of the school. No single social background dominated. It was wonderful, but not surprising to us, to see that by the end of the training, children who would not normally mix in school were walking, working and laughing together, and supporting each other through the genuinely demanding challenges that Ten Tors presents. Thank you to all our volunteers for the way you built the resilience of every pupil.

Last week, early on Friday morning, a group of Year 7 pupils made their way up to Oxford for a taster day at the University. After a long drive, we arrived at the confusingly named Exeter College, which is part of the University of Oxford. There we met Reanna, who is the Outreach Officer for the College. She introduced us to life at university and the different options that pupils have once they leave school. She also helped bust some myths about university, and Oxbridge in particular, including the myth that Oxford students never get to have any fun! We were then guided around the College by some current students who told us all about their favourite parts of university life.

After lunch in the Harry Potter-style dining hall, we made our way to the Natural History Museum, where we took turns looking around the exhibits and identifying mystery objects with one of the museum guides. This was a fantastic chance for pupils to practice some of their critical thinking skills which has been introduced as a core characteristic of a university student in our morning workshop. It was impressive to see the pupils thinking so deeply about the artifacts. After this we made our way to Wadham College for a look around another part of the University.

It was a fantastic day and hopefully one of many opportunities for Chulmleigh pupils to make links with the University and consider their post-18 options. This time around we could only take a handful of pupils - who had been nominated by the teachers for the opportunity - but we are keen to be involved in future events that the University puts on.

DofE Gold Award

On Friday 9 May, I was invited to a garden party at Buckingham Palace to celebrate achieving the Gold DofE Award. The Duke of Edinburgh (Prince Edward) was in attendance and we all enjoyed a cup of tea and a cupcake! We were so lucky with the weather and got to walk around the beautiful gardens and lake.

I completed my Bronze and Silver awards at Chulmleigh and then went on to do my Gold at QE sixth form. The Gold Award is made up of 5 elements, with the residential being an extra element to Bronze and Silver. A physical, a skill, volunteering, and an expedition are all included again, but each one is done for longer.

Those of you who know me, will know how much I love swimming, so I used that for my physical. Learning to drive was my skill, and is a skill I make use of most days now! For my volunteer-

ing section, I mentored a student with dyslexia, spending an hour a week with her during the course of the year. Our expedition was to Snowdonia, and for my residential I volunteered at Nethercott Farm, one of Michael Morpurgo's Farms for City Children. The residential is all about meeting new people and teamwork.

I really enjoyed my volunteering, it was so rewarding seeing the progress the student made with her reading, but also how she seemed happier and her school attendance improved.

The expedition was all about highs and lows, both in terms of landscape and emotions! We started our trip by hiking to the top of Mount Snowdon, before undertaking 4 days/3 nights of wild camping in Snowdonia. The wind and driving rain certainly made conditions challenging, and I remember us all sheltering behind a stone wall at one point, and later drying our tents and clothes on a fence!

I would encourage everyone to take part in DofE if they can. The new skills and experiences will stay with me for life, the expedition certainly taught me to be strong and resilient, and I was able to mention it in my personal statement for my university application.

Completing Gold feels like a real achievement, and attending the Buckingham Palace garden party was a very special day.
