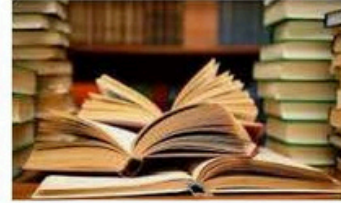

Sky-High Tribute for Mental Health Support

Last Saturday Year 11 pupil, Tom Murray, and his brother Josh took on an incredible challenge – a 15,000ft tandem skydive (nearly 3 miles high!) – to raise money for The Max Hub, part of Spark UK, a young person’s mental health charity based in North Devon.

Their jump wasn’t just for the thrill. It was in memory of their dear friend Max, who they had known since he was 8 years old. Tragically, Max took his own life in February this year at just 18. His loss has left a profound impact on all who knew him.

The Max Hub is a lifeline for young people struggling with suicidal thoughts, offering a safe space to talk and get support. Tom and Josh’s bravery was not only in the skydive itself, but in their determination to turn their grief into positive action – and what an action it was.

The dive, hosted by Skybuzz Dives at an airfield in Honiton, was the highest jump possible in the UK without an oxygen mask. It was a clear, beautiful day, and both boys absolutely loved the experience. Incredibly, neither of them felt any nerves – we are beyond proud of their courage and spirit.

And the adventure doesn’t stop there – Tom now has his sights set on wing walking. Fearless doesn't even begin to cover it!

Thanks to their amazing effort, we’ve already raised a significant amount, but there’s still time to donate. Every contribution helps support young people who desperately need someone to turn to. We are so, so grateful for your generosity.

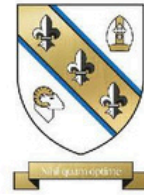
The staff were all so pleased to hear that both sibling Chulmleigh Alumni are doing well and are so proud and pleased of what they have achieved.

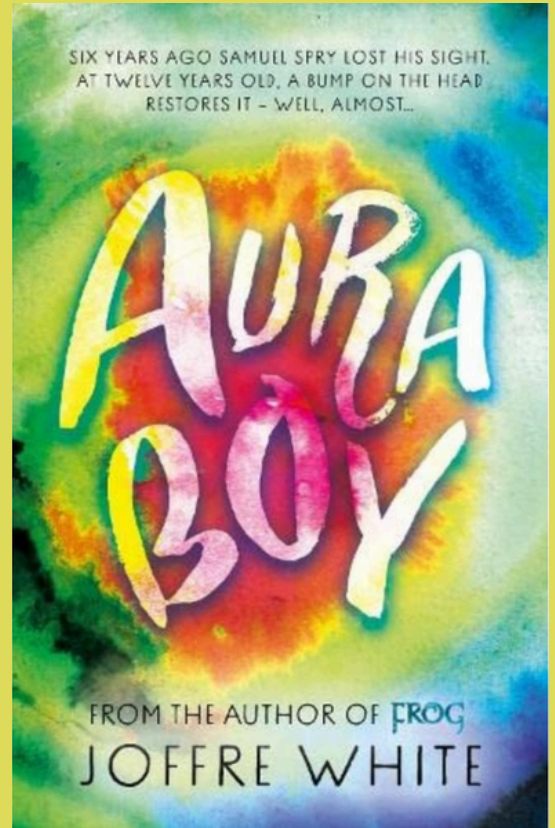


Book of the Week: Aura Boy by Joffre White
