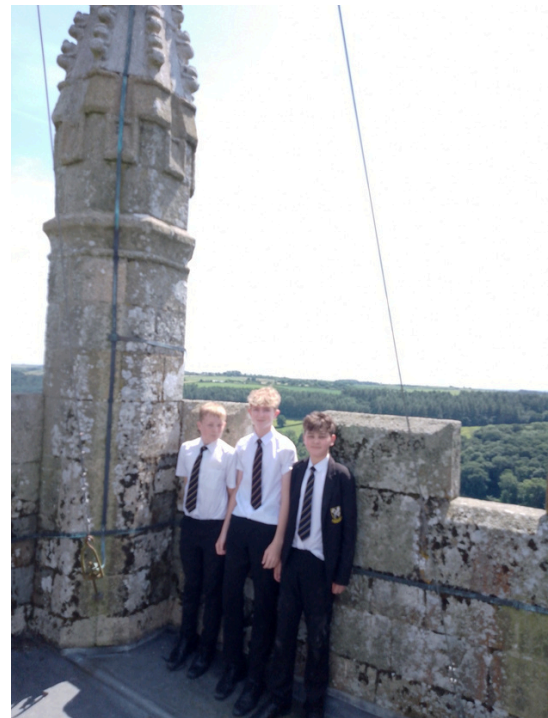


## Year 8 Visit to Chulmleigh Church

## Peter Brend Memorial Young Athletes Open Event

On Sunday 22 June three pupils from Chulmleigh College and one pupil from Chulmleigh Primary took part in the Peter Brend Memorial Young Athletes Open Event run by North Devon Athletics Club.

Annamarie Defew (Year 5) ran her first ever track race finishing 3rd in her 75m heat and then 6th in the 75m final. She also qualified for the 150m finals finishing a close 4th just 0.1 sec behind 3rd place.

Sophie Casavieille-Lacaze (Year 9) ran an incredible 200m to finish 2nd and then showed grit and determination to claim silver in a very competitive 1500m.

Elliott Defew (Year 7) jumped well to get silver in the long jump and ran a great race with a sprint up the home straight to finish 2nd in the 800m setting a new personal best.

Lilia Casavieille-Lacaze (Year 7) had a blistering 100m and won gold and then dug deep to finish 2nd in the 800m, she then jumped an amazing 1m 32cms to win gold in the high jump setting a new PB.

The four of us teamed up for the Friendship Relay to finish a hard fought 3rd against many older children.

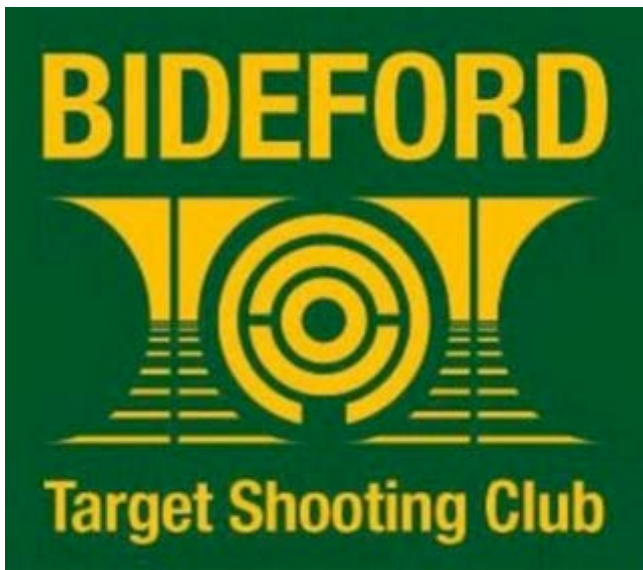

## Congratulations to Alfie Jones, Year 9 Pupil!

Year 9 pupil, Alfie Jones, has been a member of the Bideford Target Shooting Club for the past year. The club has been successfully providing a sporting facility to members of the local and wider community. Promoting sporting activities for all ages and abilities. They organise instruction and competitions at all levels of marksmanship. Developing sportsmanship and fair play. Members take part in Club, County and International competition.

Before Alfie could take part in organised competition, he had to complete a 12-week comprehensive instruction course. Alfie has been competing in the Devon Benchrest Winter League against more experienced adults. This is the first year Alfie has taken part in the League and at the annual prize giving last week, Alfie was awarded the Cyril Taylor Memorial Trophy for the most improved junior and the Peskie Trophy for the best improvement in the airgun section.





## Blue Campaign

This week we were visited by Amy Roberts from the Blue Campaign who presented Year 7 and 8 pupils with a variety of prizes for the 12 blue hearts they have painted. These hearts are used to support the Blue Campaign, which encourages people to rewild their gardens across Britain. These blue hearts will go into people's gardens, grass verges, maybe even in school, to remind and encourage people not to cut their lawns too often! Some pupils have taken their blue hearts home to put into their own gardens, and others will be put into gardens and grass verges elsewhere. Butterflies, bees, insects and birds need our wild flowers and weeds to thrive. Hopefully next academic year Chulmleigh College can have a designated "no mow" summer area for the butterflies and bees. The primary school have embraced this at their roundabout and entrance area which has been a great benefit for invertebrate life.

Our lawns, hedges and gardens are havens for our insects, which in turn support birds and other animals. If you see a blue heart in someone's garden, you know they care about keeping our wildlife healthy! Find out more about this campaign at <https://bluecampaignhub.com/> or by checking out the UNESCO Biosphere North Devon – an area of protected landscape that lies between the river Taw and the Torridge, which is recognised internationally for its rare wildlife, ancient woodlands and dunes.

Well done to all the pupils that helped to paint these, and a special big thank you to Maisie Bourne, Lilly Wilson, Poppy Smith, Sophie King, Amelia Allin and Rosie Bickers for their help. Hi Chulmleigh College, thank you for inviting me to update you guys on my music progress since leaving you in 2024 and to promote my band.

Currently, I am studying an Extended Diploma in Music Performance at Exeter College, where I met Henry Hassel, with whom I recorded a song called Breathing Days Away which was aired on BBC Devon & Cornwall Radio.

Back in January I was elated to be invited to join a band called 3 Days of Wonder whom I had admired and followed for quite a while. 3DOW write their own songs and perform rock covers - we can play all our driving anthemic rock originals as quiet acoustic sets to suit the mood of a venue if required.

I attend college with Charlie Churchill (bassist) and Finn Arnold (lead guitarist), both aged 17. Luke Notman (lead singer) has left college with three A-Levels. Within a month of joining the band, we were awarded "Best New Artist for 2025" at Devon Music Awards followed by winning an Exeter Battle of the bands evening. Between us, 3DOW spend a number of hours each week emailing, writing and applying for every music event we come across. We rehearse every Tuesday.

This year has started to roller coaster for us; we have played as support artists to a number of more well-known Southwest bands and headlined our own gigs. We have performed at the Phoenix Exeter, Barrel House Totnes, Exchange Bristol, Palladium Bideford, Junction Plymouth, the Kindred Spirits Festival, a private gig for the Royal Marines Plymouth, Devon County Show BBC Radio stage and a number of pubs, inns and music bars. Sheb Fest is approaching for us soon but sadly I am away on a prebooked holiday, however the band will play on with a stand in drummer.

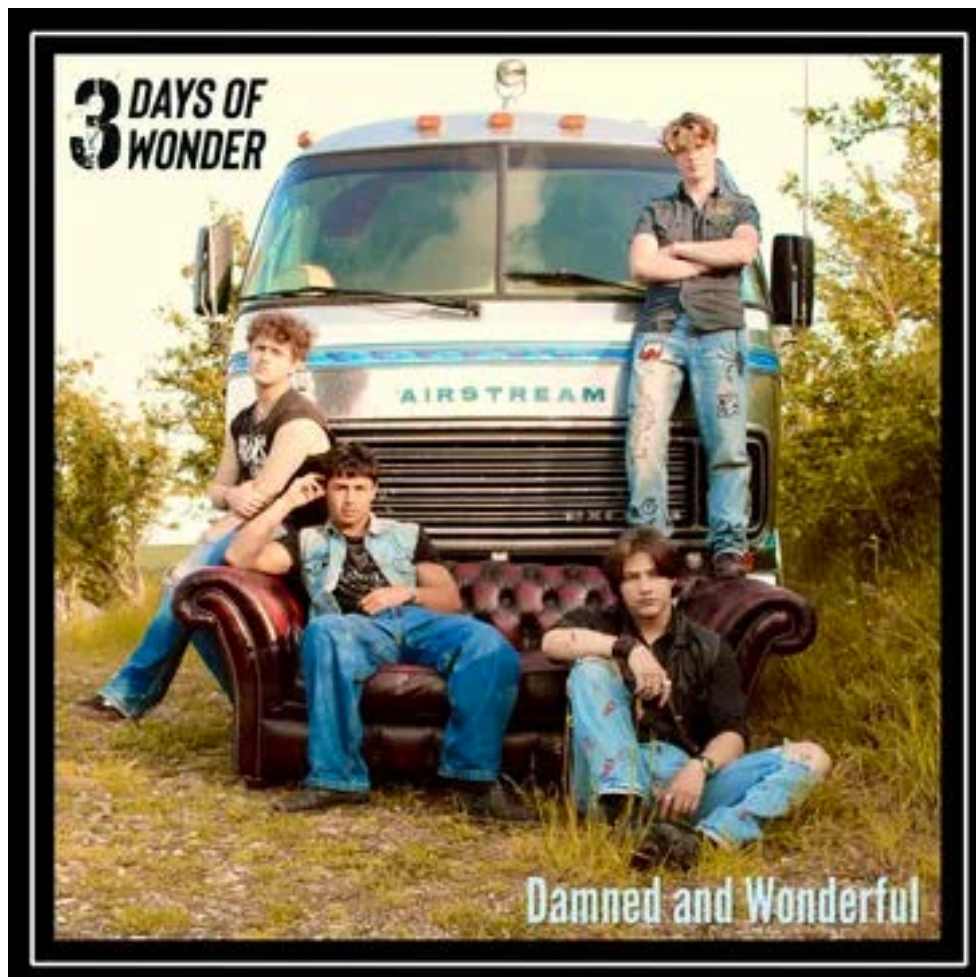

## Maths Student Community

Well done to four Year 7 pupils, Paul King, Lilia Casavieille-Lacaze, Serafina Dillon and Holly Knight who were recently nominated to apply for the Exeter Maths School Maths Student Community.

Teachers are asked to identify students within their settings who stand out from the crowd and who can find themselves working in isolation on Maths that is beyond their peers. The aim of the program is to bring these students together in a teacher-nominated programme; to enable them to work with others who are similarly able, to provide stimuli which will deepen and broaden their appreciation of Maths and its related fields, and to support and encourage their development as problem-solving mathematicians.

Congratulations to Holly Knight who has been accepted on to the program. Students enrolled on the MSC participate in three in-person events in Exeter and two online sessions each year. The in-person events are during the day in the week, and the online sessions are in the evening after school. Students will take part in masterclasses and workshops led by a mixture of EMS teachers and guest speakers. They will be introduced to mathematics beyond the normal curriculum and will have the opportunity to develop their problem solving. Until Year 9, the in-person events are held on weekdays during term time, and in Years 10 and 11 they are held on Saturdays. These events will also include some Physics and Computer Science workshops.

## Book of the Week: King of Nothing by Nathanael Lessor

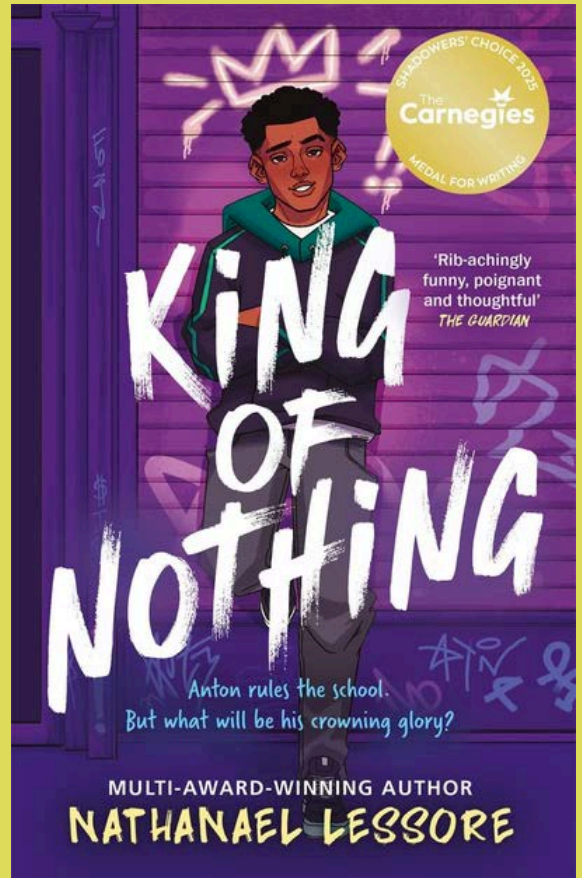
ANTON AND HIS FRIENDS ARE THE KINGS OF YEAR 9.

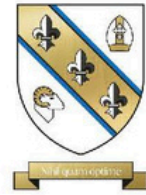
