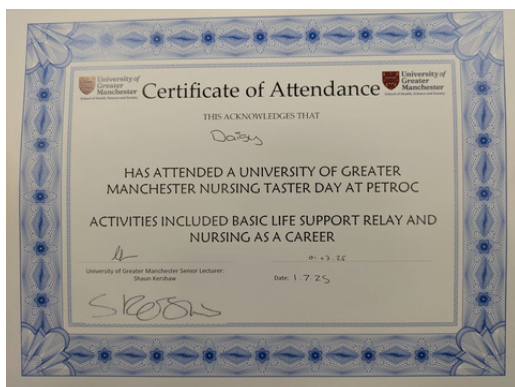
These two trips involved the whole cohort and Year 10 took great advantage of the opportunities offered to them. Many returned home from school with certificates of achievement, baked goods and course notes.

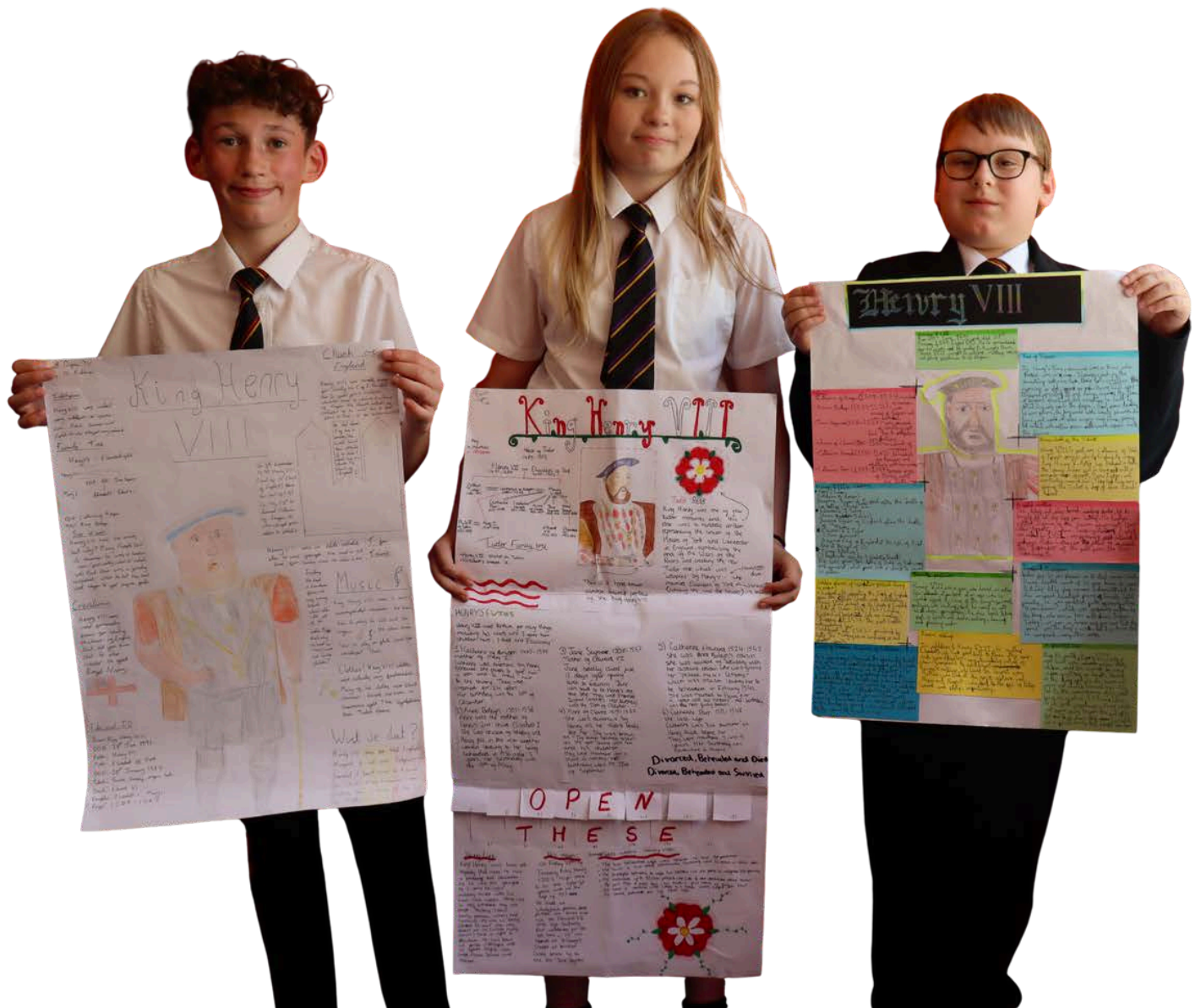

We have recently learned that former Chulmleigh College pupil, Tabitha Bradley, is about to embark on an epic walk from John O Groats to Lands End in aid of the Deaf Academy.

“My journey to the Deaf Academy began in East Worlington primary where I met my primary school best friend. It was my friend and his TA who showed me what inclusivity is. As I grew older and became aware of the wider world, they inspired me to make everyday life accessible for all. I then continued through the academy into Chulmleigh College.

Since leaving Chulmleigh I have become a learning leader at the Deaf Academy which is a unique provision in the UK, offering a specialist curriculum, teaching, support and care to deaf young people, the majority of whom have accompanying additional needs.

The Deaf Academy has launched a £60,000 fundraising appeal to transform an outdoor space into a vibrant, inclusive sensory play area tailored to its students with complex additional needs.

The current play area is outdated, uninspiring, and unsuitable for the academy’s students.

I am supporting this fundraiser by taking on the challenge of completing a walk from John O Groats to Lands End covering the distance of 1215 miles over a 61 day period, unsupported!
