### Dear Parents and Carers

In a flash we find ourselves in October and well into the Autumn Term as the nights draw in and we light our log burners, fires and fire up the central heating, I reflect on another busy week at the College.

I was delighted to show more parents around our school this week for our Open Mornings. As we approach the deadline for Secondary School Applications at the end of this month, our Open Mornings are a wonderful opportunity to see our school in session. All of us on the staff are so proud of the work we do here, and it was with huge pride that I was able to take parents around our school and show the calm atmosphere and purposeful approach to education we have. The whole College looked fantastic.

We are often asked by parents what they should do if they think they are unlikely to secure a place at the College for their Year 6 child next September. Our advice is that if you think Chulmleigh College is the right secondary school for you, place us as priority 1 as there will be a waiting list for pupils who do not initially get a place and there will be movement from the original allocations.

It has been a week of evening events at the College with parent meetings running for our trips to Sorento and Iceland, a briefing regarding Ten Tors, Year 7 settling-in meetings and our annual Countdown to GCSEs meeting for Year 11 pupils.

The Countdown to GCSE evening really sets the clock running for our Year 11 pupils, who are looking ahead to their mock examinations after the half term break and final public examinations next summer. It was wonderful to see so many parents at the meeting – but also sobering to reflect that this time next year our Year 11 pupils will have moved on to post-16 education and training. I often reference how the support parents give to their children's education is so vital – and again it was evident that parents are working hard to ensure our pupils are successful in their examinations next summer. That parent partnership is key and such a strength of our school and alongside great teaching makes the difference.

We also visited the Devonport Naval Museum where pupils experienced the lives of seafaring British people, and the ships and equipment they used, (including a submarine's periscope which allowed pupils to see across Plymouth's coast). This trip has helped our Year 11s expand their awareness of the GCSE Elizabethan course and will be very useful as they begin studying this information for their exams.

Having had visits from two writers last week, once again the College finds itself excited to welcome two more published writers.

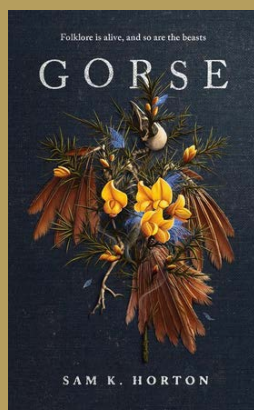

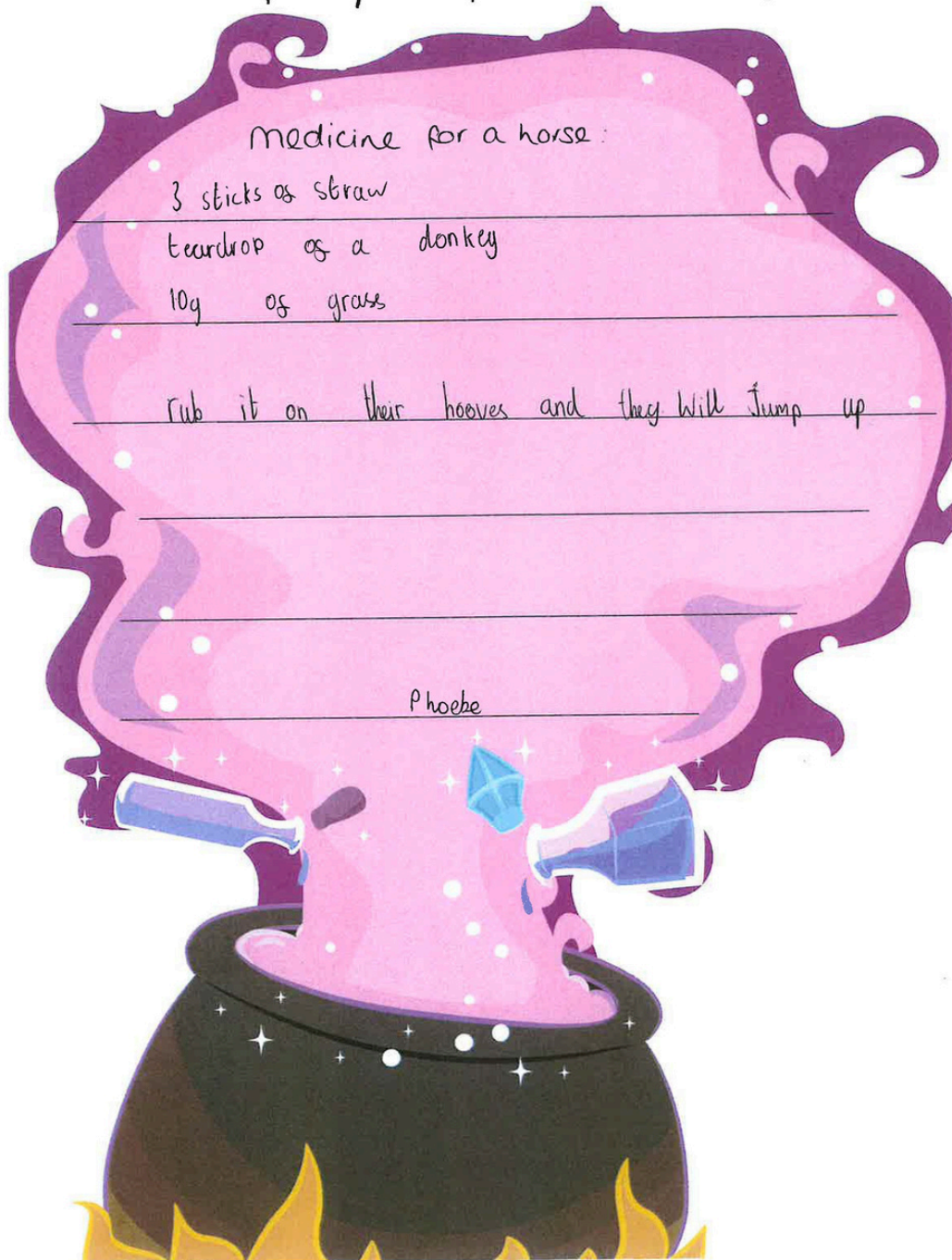




## Open Evening - Winning Spell



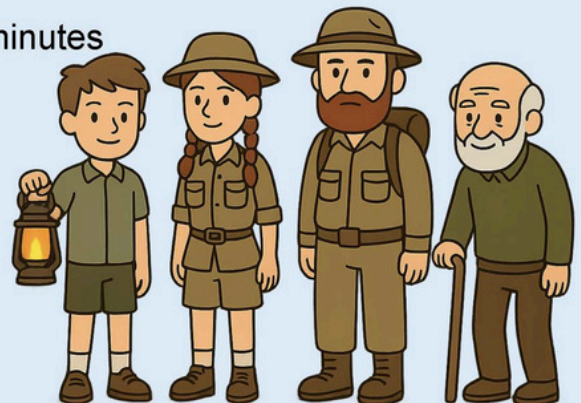
Four jungle explorers must cross a rope bridge at midnight.

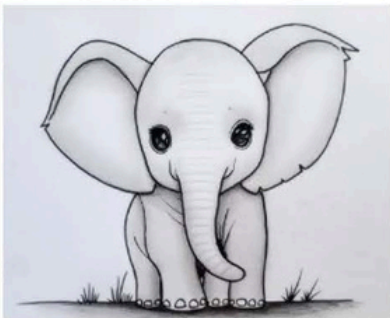

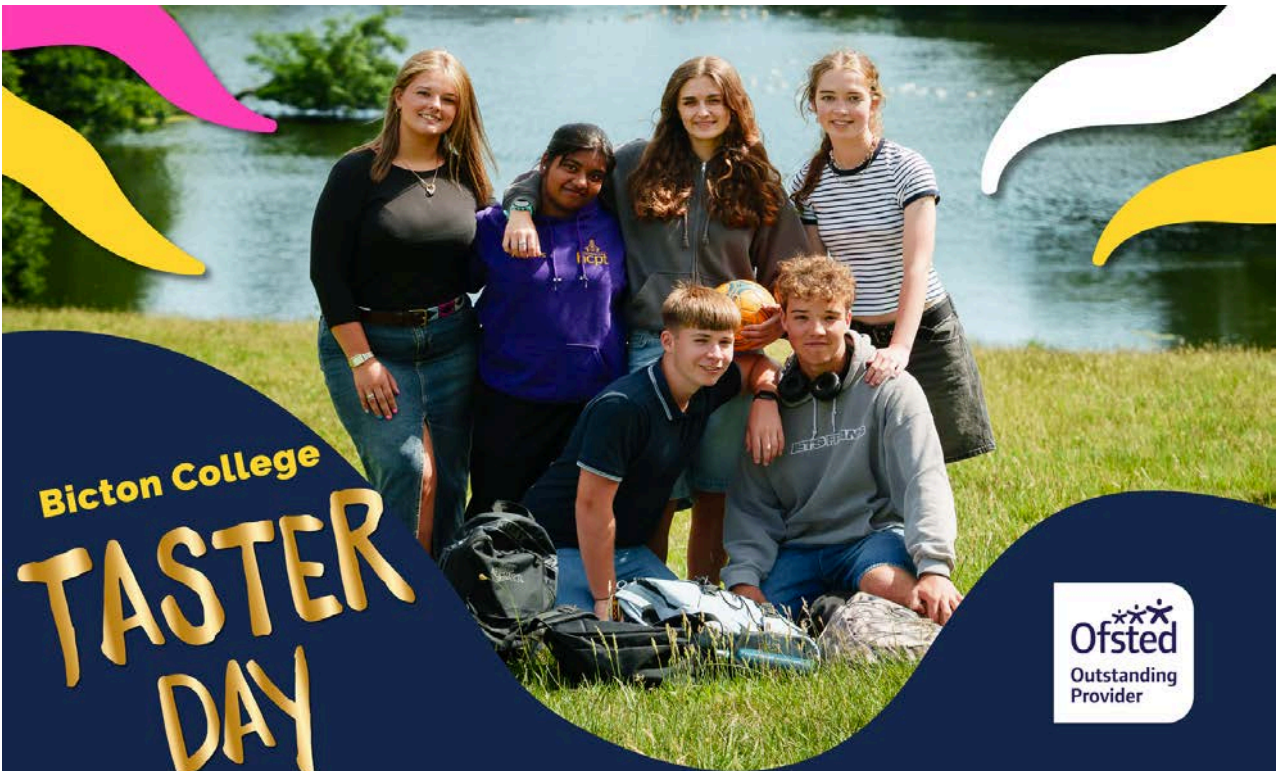


