DJ Skills Workshop

This week we welcomed in tutors from the Cameron Mills Group who spent the day working with groups of Year 9 and 10 pupils. The workshops focused on the skills needed to be a DJ, creating Drum and Bass music and how to use a professional DJ deck to create and mix their own music. This has built on recent work in curriculum lessons on Remixing and Electronic Dance Music. Pupils took turns to create their own mixes and learnt how to transition between songs by matching tempos and styles.

These were enjoyable sessions and our pupils excelled in working with new equipment and gaining a deeper understanding of this genre of music, some even took the chance to incorporate their voice with the music produced to create an authentic DJ feel!

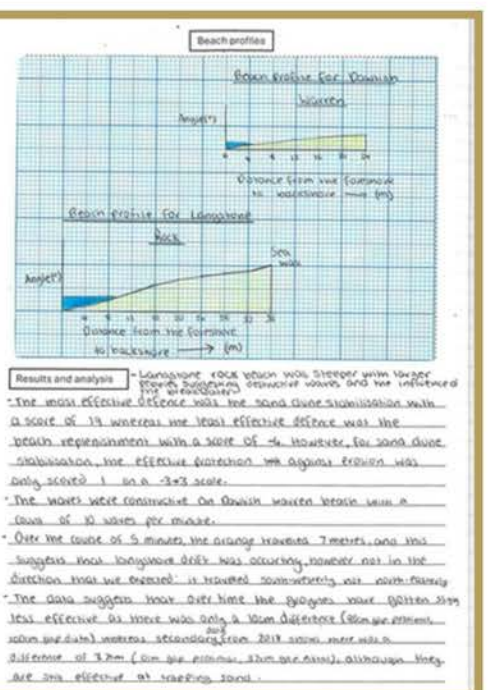
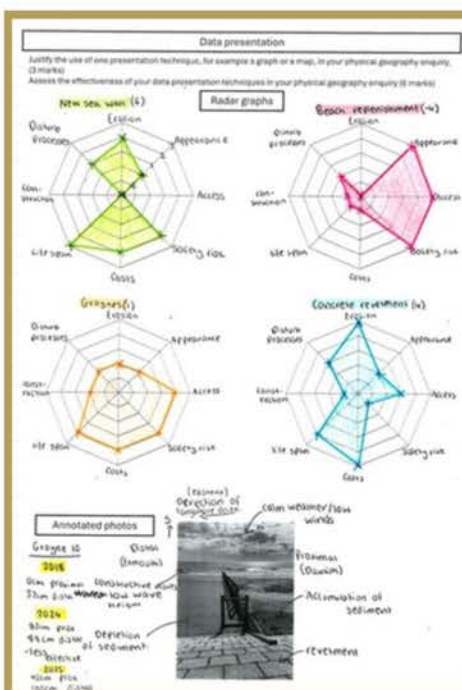


Dawlish Warren Field Trip

Year 11 GCSE Geography pupils recently went to Dawlish Warren to complete the fieldwork required for their Paper 3 exam. We were fortunate to go on a day of beautiful weather. We enjoyed exploring the area, using two data collection sites. Pupils spent time on Dawlish Warren beach and further along the coastline at Langstone Rock. A wide range of data was collected during the day. Pupils profiled the beach using the clinometers and tape measures. This allows us to see how the beach profile changed from the shoreline to the back of the beach. We stopped regularly to conduct a bi-polar analysis of each of the coastal defences. This involved assessing defences such as the groynes, sea wall and rip rap on various criteria, including lifespan, appearance, access to the beach and disruption during its construction. The moment they all waited for, however, was the longshore drift test. They had to throw an orange into the sea in order for it to catch a wave. We then tracked the orange for five minutes to see which direction it travelled. Some groups got so attached to their orange that they gave it a smiley face and a name!

The following week, when we were back in the classroom, pupils spent a few lessons presenting and analysing the data they gathered. We drew beach profiles to show the shape of the beach and radar graphs to present their bi-polar analysis data. We also evaluated our fieldwork techniques, identifying the limitations of each method and how it would be made more accurate. Here's some examples of the excellent work our pupils did in their books.

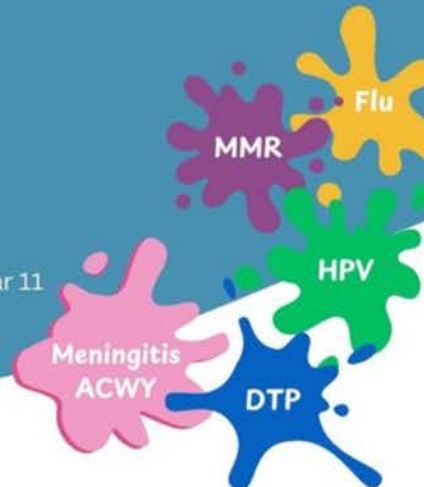
