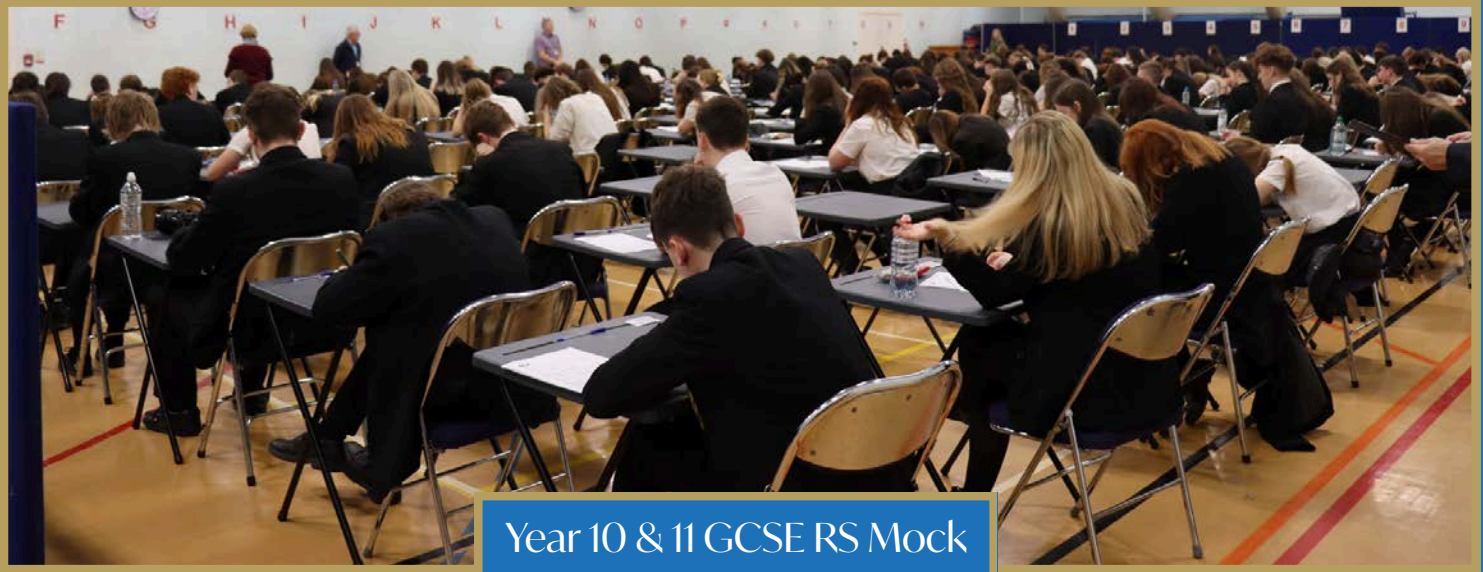

Unearthed Edition: Club Progress Update

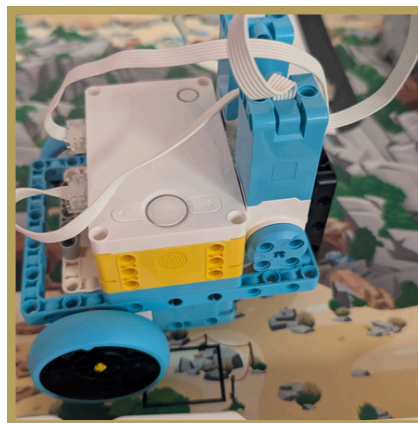
Our Robot Club has made an exciting start to this year's Lego Robot League: Unearthed Challenge. We are delighted to share that we have now received our brand-new competition robot along with all the official maps and Lego mission models. Pupils have wasted no time diving in – lunchtimes in the IT room have become a hive of activity, with teams carefully assembling mission elements, testing builds, and beginning to solve the early engineering and coding challenges.

Engagement has been fantastic. Many pupils are now attending most days, showing real commitment and problem-solving determination as they explore the missions that form this year's Unearthed theme. Their teamwork, experimentation, and creativity are already shining through, and we are looking forward to seeing how their skills develop over the coming weeks.

A special thank you goes to Mr Tillings from our Tech Department. His resourcefulness (and access to just the right off-cuts!) has enabled us to create a sturdy, permanent practice structure - meaning our robot teams can test missions accurately and consistently. This support has already made a huge difference to the pace of our progress.

We will continue to share updates as the pupils refine their designs, practise their runs, and prepare for competition day. Exciting things are ahead for Robot Club!


