## Dear Parents and Guardians

It feels great to be into March and the evenings are beginning to get longer. Thursday, of course, was World Book Day and we had a further author visit to the school organised by Mr Garrett. Reading is the foundation of everything we do in education and it was fantastic to see pupils enthused by the visit. A number of teachers wrote haikus this week as well. In all we do, it's important that we never lose sight of the fundamentals in education. Attendance, good behaviour, hard work and literacy are all so key.

You will read elsewhere of the Gold Medal success of our coding club in the Lego League! It is great to see Computer Science thriving in the College once again and my thanks and congratulations to Mr Smith and the pupils for what they have achieved.

This half term is always one of the busiest for pupils and staff and, as always, I thank families for their support of the school and the work we are doing.

## Chulmleigh Raiders of the Lost Bot – Victory at the Regional LEGO League! *Unearthing Innovation. Escaping Obstacles. One Mission at a Time.*

There are moments in school life that feel a little bit magical. The kind of day where months of tinkering, testing, debugging, redesigning, and the occasional heroic application of duct tape suddenly pay off.

Thursday delivered exactly that moment for the Chulmleigh Raiders of the Lost Bot, who competed in the regional LEGO robotics competition – and came home as overall winners.

The team impressed judges across every category of the competition. Their robot design demonstrated thoughtful engineering and careful iteration. Their problem-solving during the missions showed persistence and creative thinking. But perhaps most importantly, the judges highlighted something even more valuable: the pupils' team spirit and inclusive attitude toward the other schools competing.

Throughout the day, our pupils were seen helping other teams, sharing ideas, encouraging competitors, and embodying exactly the kind of collaborative engineering culture that the competition hopes to inspire. In robotics, as in science, the best progress rarely comes from working alone – it comes from curious minds supporting each other.

When the final judging scores were combined across robot performance, design, teamwork, and problem solving, the Raiders of the Lost Bot rose to the top and were announced as overall champions of the event.

The journey home was suitably celebratory. Somewhere between the competition venue and Devon, the minibus filled with a slightly chaotic but very enthusiastic rendition of “We Are the Champions” by Queen, sung at full volume by a group of pupils who had just achieved something remarkable together.

Winning the regional competition means the adventure is not over. The team is now preparing for the National Finals in Harrogate, where they will compete against the best robotics teams from across the country. The pupils are already discussing improvements to the robot, new strategies for the mission table, and ways to refine their engineering approach before the next stage.

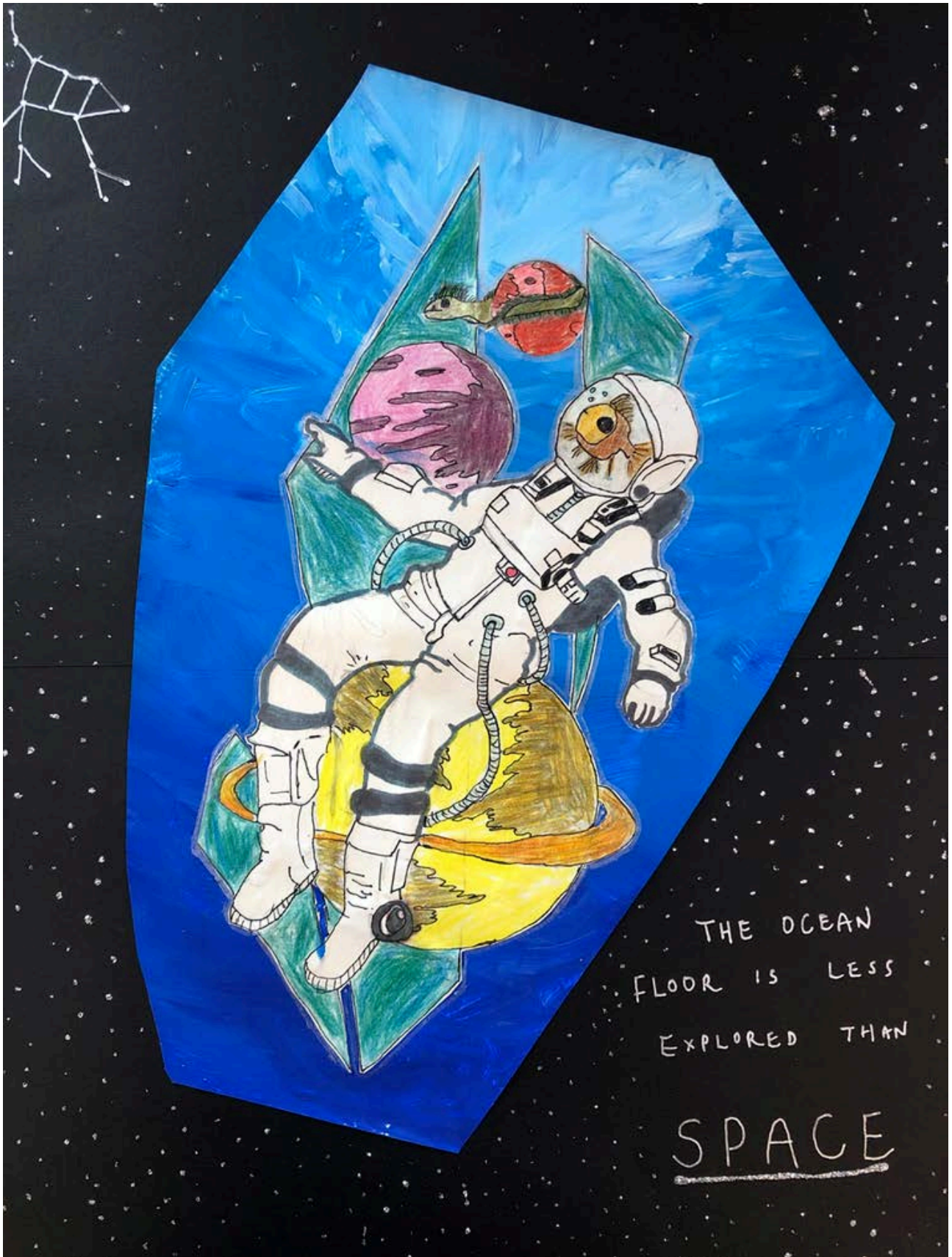

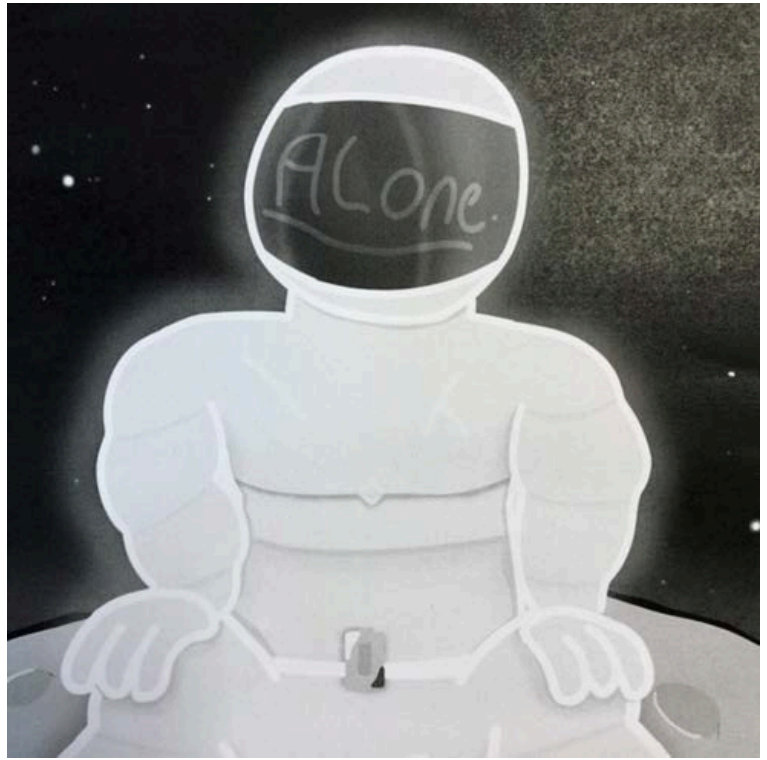



## School Lunches - Information for Pupils and Parents

- Should a pupil not have enough funds on their account, they should visit the Pupil Support Office before going to the canteen, where they should obtain a meal slip.
- Pupils are able to check their account balances using the machines located at the entrances to the canteen.
- All free school meal (FSM) pupils have accounts topped up daily with £2.61. This credit does not show when you check your balance on the fingerprint machines but will show up on the tills. If you have debt, this is on your personal account and not your FSM account and will need to be paid off by parents at some point. It does mean that all FSM pupils have £2.61 to spend every day whether their personal account is in debt or not.
- If pupils are not set up with fingerprint access, or if it is not working, please go to reception.
- We would also like to remind parents and carers that pupils eligible for free school meals may eat at both breaktime and lunchtime within their allowance. A breakfast option is available at breaktime (two slices of toast with a topping or a bowl of cereal) for 41p, leaving sufficient balance for a main meal, pasta dish, sandwich, or similar option at lunchtime.
- Parents may check which meals their children are purchasing by going to the MyEd app. Select accounts (bottom right of screen), select the month and then select the day of purchase that you want to check.
- The full menu and price list is available on the College website and in Optime.
- We kindly ask that you ensure your child's account is topped up regularly to avoid any inconvenience.
